

FINAL EXAMINATION

A candidate for a master's degree must take a final examination. The final examination may be oral or written or may consist of satisfactory completion of coursework. The format and scope of the final examination are determined by the department or program. The examination must cover, if applicable, the candidate's thesis, professional paper, or project, and/or major and minor fields of study, as well as other pertinent material required by the department or program. The examining committee, approved by the Dean of the Graduate School, consists of a minimum of two members from the student's degree program.

The Certificate of Completion (<https://www.twu.edu/gradschool/forms/>) (for Professional Papers and Exhibits/Recitals) must be filed in the Graduate School by the date specified for each semester in the Graduate School's "Graduation Deadlines (<https://www.twu.edu/gradschool/current-students/degree-completion/>). (<https://www.twu.edu/gradschool/forms/>)" Students completing a degree with coursework only are not required to submit a Certificate of Completion.
