The Master of Arts in Reading Education degree includes required master's coursework with a thesis as the capstone experience. Optional to this degree, upon completion of the coursework and all TEA requirements, graduate students may be eligible take the Texas All-Level (K-12) Reading Specialist Certification exam. If this optional certification is pursued, the TWU EPP Graduate Professional Certification Application must be completed prior to beginning the coursework.

Students already holding a master's degree may take 18 semester credit hours of core coursework to be recommended for the Reading Specialist certificate.

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Marketable Skills
