

POST-MASTER'S CERTIFICATE OF ADVANCED STUDY - EDUCATIONAL DIAGNOSTICIAN

The Post-Master's – Educational Diagnostician Certificate Program prepares students to teach, evaluate, and advocate for students with disabilities. Highly-qualified educational diagnosticians are in high demand across Texas, and this graduate program will meet the need by preparing them to assess students' academic, cognitive, social, emotional, and behavioral needs and how to collaborate with teachers to recommend accommodations, modifications, and interventions based on assessment results.

To obtain a recommendation for certification through Texas Woman's University, an individual must have a master's degree (preferably in education or an education-related field), three years of creditable teaching experience, a valid Texas teaching certificate, and completion of coursework (at least 18 semester credit hours, including EDSP 5833, EDSP 5843, and EDSP 5863) on a plan of study leading to certification. The number of semester credit hours required and specific coursework varies depending on the student's academic preparation and experience.
